

## Wraparound Provision Covid-19 Risk Assessment – Return to school

## School reopening: Wraparound provision risk assessment/recovery plan

Documents the risk control measures school have in place to restart our wraparound provision, such as after-school and breakfast clubs, from September. It covers the measures we need above and beyond the usual control measures we have in place to run your wraparound provision, for example related to security, fire safety and hygiene during food preparation.

School has considered measures workable in our school. For example, take into account:

- > The number of staff and pupils you expect to have in
- > The type of activity (e.g. if you're serving food)
- Any <u>risk assessments for individual staff</u> that you do, particularly for staff who are at higher risk of contracting or becoming seriously ill from coronavirus (e.g. those who are clinically vulnerable and/or who are BAME)
- > Any reasonable adjustments you'll need to make to enable everyone to follow the measures, including pupils with EHC plans (e.g. having signs written in Braille, designing approaches to help children with challenging behaviour who may struggle to follow the rules)
- > The size and layout of your school premises
- > The resources you have in stock or can order easily (e.g. soap, cleaning products)

We've also highlighted in yellow some particular parts you'll need to adapt – delete the yellow text as you go. In some sections you may want to add relevant measures from your whole-school risk assessment – we've noted in yellow where this is most likely.

Contact with someone suffering from coronavirus	• Staff • Pupils	Everyone will be asked not to attend the wraparound provision if they need to self-isolate under current guidance. Regular reminders will be given about this.  Anyone self-isolating with symptoms will be encouraged to access testing and engage with the NHS Test and Trace process.  If a symptomatic person attends the wraparound provision, they will be sent home immediately or isolated until they can be picked up. Isolation room located in Reception area. 999 will be called if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk. In the case of a symptomatic pupil who needs to be supervised before being picked up:  If a distance of 2m can't be maintained, supervising staff will wear a fluid-resistant surgical mask  If contact is necessary, supervising staff will also wear disposable gloves and a disposable apron  If there's a risk of splashing to the eyes, such as from coughing, spitting or vomiting, supervising staff will also wear eye protection  Supervising staff will wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after the pupil has been picked up.  A deep clean will take place in the areas that the symptomatic person has been in, and PPE will be disposed of properly, following decontamination guidance  If the school becomes aware that a pupil or a staff member has tested positive for coronavirus, the school will contact the local health protection team and follow any guidance they provide. 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Contact with coronavirus when getting to and from school		Everyone will be encouraged to walk or cycle into school, and asked to avoid taking public transport during peak times if possible.  Car-Sharing is only permitted for the purposes of one household linking with another to form a childcare/support bubble — Any children in school who are part of a childcare/support bubble with other pupils have been advised to provide details of school pupils in those bubbles for track and trace purposes.  All children attending Breakfast Club will be required to attend at 7.45am. School cannot accommodate staggered starts to Breakfast Club w.e.f 22.3.2021.  Anyone who needs to take public transport will be referred to government guidance.  Parents/carers who need to drop off and pick up pupils will be told through messages and signage:  Their allocated drop off and collection times, with different groups being given different times  The protocols for minimising adult to adult contact Separate entrance for Breakfast Pupils to drop off and collect. Breakfast Club drop off point – Hall doors.  That only one parent/carer should attend  Not to gather at entrance gates or doors  If a childminder often comes to school to drop off/pick up several children, we will request they let us know so we can adjust our risk assessment accordingly. 		Pupils will be encouraged to learn and practise these habits in lessons and by posters put up in the areas used for the wraparound provision.			
		Help will be available for any pupils who have trouble cleaning their hands independently. Skin friendly cleaning wipes can be used as an alternative. Young children will be supervised during hand washing.			
		Consider if there are any pupils attending the provision that won't be able to maintain good respiratory hygiene, such as pupils with complex needs who spit uncontrollably or use saliva as a sensory stimulant, and if there are different/additional measures you can put in place for these children and the staff who work with them.			
		Supplies for soap, hand sanitiser and disposable paper towels and tissues will be topped up regularly and monitored to make			

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		sure they're not close to running out.  Lidded bins for tissues, preferably operated by a foot pedal, will be emptied at the end of the activity.			
Spreading infection through contact with coronavirus on surfaces		Areas of the school that are used by pupils will be cleaned thoroughly at the end of the activity.  As part of this, cleaning staff will use standard cleaning products (e.g. bleach, detergent) to clean frequently touched surfaces including:  Classroom desks and tables  Bathroom facilities (including taps and flush buttons)  Door and window handles  Outdoor handrails and gates  Furniture  Light switches  Teaching and learning aids  Books and games and other classroom-based resources  Computer equipment (including keyboards and mouse)  Sports equipment  Hard toys  Outdoor play equipment  Breakfast Club staff will clean down/sanitise all hard surface/equipment once children move to class on daily basis.  Pupils and parents/carers will be asked to limit the amount of equipment they bring to the wraparound provision to essentials like bags, hats, coats, books, stationery and mobile phones. Spreading infection due to excessive contact and mixing between pupils and staff during the activity		Where possible, keeping pupils in the same groups that they're in during the school day, for example with others in their year group or 'bubble'      If that's not practical, having pupils in small, consistent groups of max 15 pupils  Children will be grouped into Breakfast Club Bubbles by Key stage and have a designated member of Breakfast Club staff. Within those Breakfast Club Bubbles children will also be socially distanced by Year Group. School will operate 2 breakfast Club Bubbles Breakfast Club Bubble 1 (Reception, year 1 and year 2) and Breakfast Club Bubble 2 (years 3-6)  Children will be grouped with a maximum of 15 pupils to 1 Adult dependant on space operating within.  Breakfast Club activities will take place outside where possible – parents to ensure children have appropriate footwear and warm, waterproof coat.  On days Breakfast Club cannot operate outside children will be in their Breakfast Club Bubbles either in the hall, Library area or KS2 Concourse. When inside children will access desk-top activities at tables set socially distanced apart within their year Group.  Children in the EYFS will be kept in consistent groups based on their age groups, wherever possible, while adhering to the usual staffing ratios. If children need to be in mixed age groups, we will adhere to the EYFS staffing ratios as applicable.  Where pupils are old enough and capable enough, they will be taught and reminded to maintain their distance and not touch staff or peers.  Where possible, pupils will be seated side-by-side and facing forwards, and unnecessary furniture will be moved out of spaces used for activities to allow for this. 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		We will avoid group activities that involve singing, chanting or shouting.			
		Live performances to an audience will not take place.			
		For physical activity, contact sports will be avoided. Outdoor sports will be prioritised where possible, or large indoor spaces used where it is not. Distance between pupils will be maximised as much as possible.			
		Staff will keep their distance from pupils and other staff as much as they can (ideally 2 metres apart). This won't always be possible, particularly when working with younger children, but close face-to-face contact will be avoided, and time spent within 1 metre will be minimised.			
		Any pupils with complex needs or who need close contact care will have the same support as normal as distancing isn't possible here. Staff will be rigorous about hand washing and respiratory hygiene.			
		Parents will be made aware that staff working in Breakfast Club also work in another Year Group Bubble within school. SLT and Governors have been made aware of this increased risk and the risk this poses if there is an outbreak in Breakfast Club – this could potential cause a full/partial closures of the school.			
Spreading infection due to excessive contact and mixing between pupils and staff around and outside of the school		Wherever possible, pupils will be kept in the same groups at all times, and be kept separate from other groups.  All children attending Breakfast Club MUST attend at 7.45am. Breakfast will be served in the Hall 7.45 – 8.00am. Children will be seated in their tables by Year Group within their designated Breakfast Club Bubble Group. Social distancing will be maintained at all times.  Movement around the school site will be restricted to the Breakfast Club areas and movement within those areas kept to a minimum. Rooms will be accessed directly from outside where possible, and any corridors will have one-way circulation or a divider down the middle to keep groups apart.  Toilet use will be managed to avoid crowding. Only use disabled toilet adjacent to Library/Hall area.  We will advise parents/carers to limit the number of extended service providers they use as far as possible, so their children mix with fewer groups. We will advise parents/carers that if they are using other extended service providers, they should seek assurances about the providers' protective measures.  Breakfast Club staff will communicate with each other and other school staff via walkie talkie in school to reduce contacts between staff and other pupils outside of their Bubble Group. Fire, first aid and emergency procedures will be reviewed to make sure they can still be followed with limited staff and changes to how the school space is being used.  Ventilation: is a challenge in the hall area as it has no ventilation. Fire doors cannot be open due to safeguarding risk.  • Hall Doors into corridor will be propped open, Library area windows will be opened, where fire safety and safeguarding wouldn't be compromised. Once breakfast club finished Hall Fire Doors will be open for 15 minutes to create circulation of air. Covid-19 particles live in the air for up to 6 hours. If Breakfast/ASC Club staff are required to isolate then school will temporarily suspend the Breakfast Club/ASC Club provision, please note because staff in Breakfast Club also work in Year Group Bubbles this is likely to have an impact on the wider closing of Year group Bubbles across school.
