- Share religious stories with you child. Encourage them to talk about what they have heard and share their understanding of the stories



Communication and Language

- Continue to share the stories we have read about bears with your family at home
- Can you think of some different sounds for the bear hunt? What sounds would your family make if they went through the thunderstorm or along the beach or through a cave?

Maths

- Encourage your child to help you when you are out shopping to collect objects for your basket or trolley, e.g. 'Can you get me two apples?'
- Talk about day and night. What do we do in the morning and what do we do at night?

Literacy-Writing

- Encourage children to use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing. Can they hear and write the initial sounds in words e.g 'm' for mummy, 'd' for daddy?
- Motivate your child to mark make with a range of pencils, crayons, chalks and pens

Understanding the World

- Use a paint/drawing program on the ipad or tablet for children to draw pictures of their favourite teddy bear or one from a story they have heard



Literacy-Reading

- Do you have a book about a teddy bear?
- Can you share it with an adult and talk about the story?



Expressive Arts and Design

- Draw a picture of your favourite teddy bear
- Make bed or a carrier out of cardboard boxes for your bear



Physical Development

- Roll out the playdough and use a tool to write your name in it
- Use the playdough to shape the letters of your name
- Use playdough to shape and mould different types of bears
