 Talk to your child about who loves and cares for them - How do they know? What do these special people do for them to show them that they love and care for them?

Communication and Language

 To help your child develop their vocabulary talk to them as much as possible about what they are doing. Ask them about their day. What have they been doing? What was their favourite activitiy?



Maths

 Make handprints of everyone's hands in your family. You can paint your hands or draw round your hands.
Cut them out and put them in size order from smallest to largest.



Literacy

 Go on a listening walk around the house or garden and listen carefully to all the different sounds you can hear. Talk about what you heard. Did you recognise any of the sounds?
Were they loud or quiet?

 Look at a picture book and talk about what you see in the pictures.
Can you hold the book the right way and turn the pages one at a time?



Expressive Arts and Design

 Can you teach someone at home one of the nursery rhymes we have been singing? See if you can remember all the words and actions

 Help your child to develop their independence with their toileting needs, flushing the toilet and washing their hands. Encourage them to be able to manage buttons, zips etc when putting on or taking off their coats.
